


### How Teachers Have Adjusted To Zoom By: Isabella Vega

The school has provided students with choices as to how they would prefer to return: RLI (Remote Learning Instruction) or FCL (Flexible Combined Learning).


Those who chose RLI will continue the school year virtually as they have been doing but those who chose FCL are more complex than that.

.To reduce crowding and contamination, they will be divided into two groups (e.g. red group and blue group) and will attend brick and mortar different days. For clarity purposes, we'll use the example that the red group is last names A-L and the blue group is M-Z. The red group would attend school Monday and Tuesday, Blue group would attend school Wednesday and Thursday, and both would do virtual school on Fridays. This format would allow for minimal contact and maximum efficiency. This isn't the only thing that would change, however, there will be new rules applied as well.

The rules would be adjusted to fit the situation and keep students safe. They are as follows: students must bring their own device and masks, ill-feeling students must stay at home, assigned seats will be implemented, all gatherings will be online, and there will be no changing for P.E.

While these are all effective methods, how would lunch work? The maximum capacity would be 300 people rather than 1000 in the cafeteria and students can eat all around campus. Students must also bring pre-packaged lunches (no deliveries) and their own water bottles. Early releases are also being modified. There will be no hanging around at 6 am while waiting for classes to start or after 3 pm while waiting to be picked up.
