King's rise to fame as a national leader was highlighted bv the Montgomery Bus Boycott. which was brought on by Rosa Parks' arrest for refusing to give up her seat to a white passenger. His leadership of the 381-day boycott ultimately resulted in Montgomery's desegregation of public transportation and

Some people are surprised to find that Doral Academy isn't one school- it's three. The School of Technology and School of Performing Arts integrate to give Doral Academy students access to all the opportunities they need to succeed in a field they're passionate about. From coding to dance, you'd be surprised to find just how much the schools offer. Participating in competitions, tournaments, and events galore, it's a one stop shop to success in your field. The best part, however, is the people you'll meet along the way. The typically small class sizes let you really make close connections with others. and it helps to know you all have a passion in common already.

In the School of Performing Arts. over 400 students are mentored and specialize in 10 categoriestheater. dance. art. keyboard, orchestra, band, guitar, chorus, TV production, and photography. These 10 disciplines open huge doors in terms of scholarships. media recognition, and career paths.

Over the last teacher planning day weekend, Doral hosted its annual auditions, inviting students to be a part of this program. Several teachers, juniors and volunteered seniors as iudges. "For auditions we asked students from all levels of experience a few questions and had them present their portfolio." says Priscilla Gocende, judge of the Photography Program. Gocende is a professional photographer who's been running her own business, Poised Photography, for the past two years. "Without being in performing arts, I wouldn't have been where I am now. I mean. the taught program me everything 1 needed to succeed." According to her, the Photography Program received 18 auditions this year, and candidates were encouraged to submit portfolios unique to illustrate their own photographic style.

Isabella Mineo, judge of the Theatre Program, described a very different audition process. "Each person was recite required to а monologue under 2 minutes long. and they can afterwards share any special talents they have (singing, dancing, etc.)" The theater community in our school is committed. fiercely and they make up a larger portion of students in comparison to the other

arts. Around 74 candidates were put to the test, and those that pass will go on to join an intense (but very fun) high school extracurricular.

One of the most highly regarded programs however. is the TV Production Program, more commonly known as FBTV. In charge of making announcements morning today, these students are the reporters and filmmakers of tomorrow. The award-winning program had Valentina Torres as a judge for the auditions, and stated that "The she auditionees had to prepare a demo reel demonstrating their work and pass a simple 3-question interview" to be considered.

All in all, if you have a passion, go for it! There's nothing to lose in the audition process, and you'll be surrounded by people who'll support you every step of the way. The key to succeeding?
